BIOGRAPHY

George Smart, known as Mr. Modernism, is a leading authority in historic preservation for Modernist design. As the founder and CEO of the 501C3 USModernist®, George and his intrepid staff and volunteers created the world's largest open educational archive dedicated to the documentation, preservation, and promotion of Modernist residential architecture. His energy and perseverance for preserving mid-century Modernism and his deep understanding of design's cultural impact made him a respected, passionate, reasoned voice and an internationally recognized advocate. George led USModernist's growth and influence in the preservation movement, raising awareness and inspiring action in architectural circles and beyond.

Under George's leadership, USModernist has documented over 23,000 houses, built and unbuilt, of over 140 major 20th-century architects and scanned over 5 million pages of architectural magazines over the last 130 years. This extensive work preserved architectural history and transformed public access, making publications available and text-searchable for the first time. George and USModernist have been awarded 20 honors for leadership in historic preservation, including the prestigious AIA Institute Honors for Collaborative and Professional Achievement.

George is a vocal advocate for the care of significant American Modernist design. He educates the public on the value of Modernism and promotes preservation. A frequent speaker to architecture, preservation, and museum audiences, George brings the world of Modernist architecture to life through engaging entertaining storytelling and expert informative insights. Whether in person or online, he leaves audiences laughing and inspired, motivating people to appreciate and champion Modernist preservation in their own communities.


